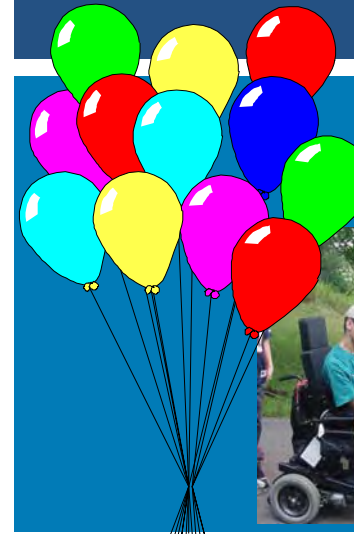

Celebrating 35 Years!



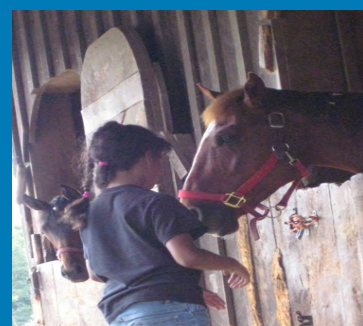
As we celebrate our 35th Anniversary, we can't help but to look back and see how we've grown since our inception. NHR was created through the vision of Ellen Hymes in 1974 in New York City. Hymes, and other parents of children with developmental disabilities, found themselves dissatisfied with the options available for their sons' and daughters' care. NHR was established as an effort to provide progressive care for these people so important to them. Their philosophy was to provide individuals with developmental disabilities with the lifetime ability to lead meaningful and productive lifestyles, and most importantly, to provide them with the ability to have a say in their own lives.

Unfortunately, New Horizons was met with resistance from the beginning. Following their original idea to establish an extensive village community for individuals with developmental disabilities, in 1978, with great hope and excitement, New Horizons purchased a plot of land in Vineland, NJ. After spending two years and thousands of dollars, in 1980 the New Jersey Division of Mental Retardation rescinded upon their initial approval of the Vineland site. A blow that would have discouraged many, New Horizons plunged on. Their next newsletter featured an article by Hymes under the cheery title "Farewell New Jersey – Hello New York", truly showing the optimistic, forward-facing attitude that New Horizons has had since the beginning.

The fruits of these efforts to move on manifested themselves soon. In 1981, New Horizons took charge of its first four group homes serving twenty-eight individuals. Today we now have 32 homes and supportive apartments, and between these and other services providing care to 400 people. Clearly, we have grown – and this change is not the only one New Horizons has seen in its thirty-five years.

Our administrative offices have certainly made some moves, starting on the second floor of an office building in Millbrook, and in 1984 we had

Thoughts On Thirty Five...by Regis Obijiski

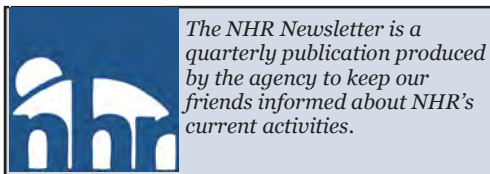
Our story is about people. Our business is one of relationships. Over the past 35 years, New Horizons has changed its corporate address many times, increased its locations of supports and services to 32, and grown its annual budget to over \$20 million. Nevertheless, places and funding have always remained secondary to people—people with developmental disabilities and the people who provide important supports for them.

To see where we have come in the past 35 years, let's briefly visit with a few people who have been receiving supports from New Horizons for at least 25 years. Each when very young was placed by their family members in an upstate institution. At the time, this is what was available, and living with a few hundred other people was typical.

Peter explains that his life really began anew when he moved "off the Ellenville campus" to Pinewood—a group home. That gave him the momentum to plan for and eventually rent his own apartment in New Paltz where he got to work and around his community on his famous one-speed bike with fat tires and coaster brakes. A string of

successes nurtured his confidence to study for and obtain his motor vehicle permit and take weekly lessons with a driving school. If his neurologist didn't advise against it, he would be driving a car today. Never discouraged by set-backs, Pete thought he could advance his status from renter to home-owner. Support staff presented him with a unique federal mortgage assistance program that enabled him to buy a modest home in Kingston where he currently lives with two of his friends. For a few years, Pete was a member of the New Horizons' board of directors, and that gave him plenty of opportunity to exercise his brand of good-natured governance: "Just because you are staff, that doesn't make you right."

Sylvia and Israel's relationship was a marriage made in heaven...and on earth. After dating for over 20 years and experiencing periodic separations of geography, they were sure they wanted to get married, so their support staff assisted them with all of the details. Theirs was a grand and unforgettable wedding, followed by a lovers' honeymoon to Niagara Falls and a newly renovated apartment in Kerhonkson.

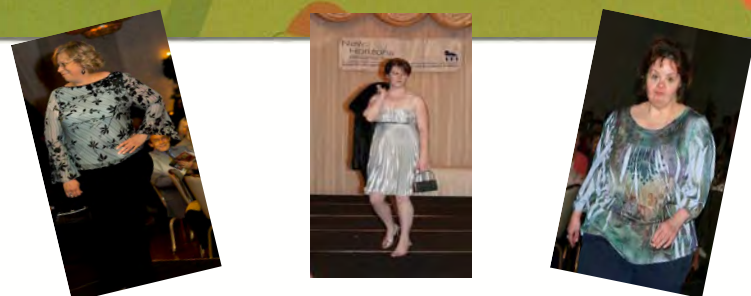

Emboldened by this example of love of love and courage, **Debbie and Joe** declared their intentions and were married near their home in High Falls.

Warren and Jon were buddies on the Ellenville campus. They moved to New Horizons' Mountain View group home in Napanoch and eventually to a two-bedroom apartment. I recall waves of criticism directed at the organization for promoting what was considered irresponsible risk-taking with two vulnerable and skill-inept men. Eighteen years later, neither gentleman would countenance a return to a congregate setting. Jon has been named Employee of the Month several times at the ShopRite supermarket, and Warren has been publicly lauded at his one-man art shows of three dimensional representations from New Paltz to Kingston.

There are many other impossible dreams realized by people with disabilities and their families. Here are few paraphrases from family members:

- ◆ "I never thought my young daughter would stay an entire weekend at NHR's weekend respite at Briggs Farm. When I saw the disappointment in her face that the weekend was over, I understood that her possibilities were all in front of her."
- ◆ "I was afraid to let go of Kevin until I saw him grow in ways unimaginable to my wife and me and our two other kids."
- ◆ "Imagine. 'T' has his own house."
- ◆ "Our Matt is so lovable and so much fun. We didn't know so many others would feel the same."

Obviously, the most important person at New Horizons is a person with disabilities. The second most important person is s/he who most directly supports an individual with disabilities....and so on down the line to administration and governance. As much as is humanly possible, we measure what we do against our unifying principles of integrity, positive relationships, respect, innovation, and learning.

additional offices with the opening of NHR's Ellen P. Hymes campus in Ellenville. Unfortunately, in 1987 a main building of the campus was destroyed by fire and the agency chose to move on from the site. In December of 1992 we then moved from Millbrook to a larger office space on Van Wagner Road in Poughkeepsie. While it was sad to leave the community we had become a part of in Millbrook, the energy of growth was exciting. The offices at Van Wagner, which seemed unimaginably spacious in 1992, were woefully outgrown by 2008, prompting our move in January of 2008 to our training & administrative building on West Road in Pleasant Valley.

Our fund-raising efforts started with events like the 1979 Mercedes 450 SEL raffle with Yogi Berra drawing the winning raffle stub. Two years later the New Horizons Foundation was created, which in 2009 will celebrate annual fundraising events including: 26th Annual Invitational Golf Tournament (May), 14th Annual Community Leadership Breakfast (Oct.) and its 6th Annual Fall Into Fashion Show (Oct.).

From starting by serving few and growing to serving many, from a Mercedes raffle in 1979 to the 6th annual Fashion Show, and from starting in a small office space and moving to our beautiful, new building, over the past thirty-five years New Horizons has grown unimaginably. Yet, over this time the mission and core spirit of this agency has stayed the same: to be people helping people where they need it. I'm sure that if Ellen Hymes could see us now, she would be proud of what her agency has become.

MHC's – 17th Annual DSP Conference

After 12 days of rain, the sun broke out and shined upon the Mid-Hudson Coalition's conference on June 25th at the Oakwood School. NHR has been a staunch supporter of the MHC and its mission of professionalism for DSPs since its inception. This year's conference was no exception. Fifty-two NHR staff lived up to our unifying principle of life long learning by attending the conference.

During the opening ceremonies, the DSP Awards for Excellence Throughout the Lifespan were presented. Fifty-four DSPs, four from NHR: Tina Fagan (Stormville), Rose Farrell (Clintondale), Raymond Njunge (Overlook) and Janette Pagan (Canal Path) were recognized by their coworkers for their exceptional work. Raymond was the recipient of the award in the service to adults category.

The keynote address was delivered by Matt Giordano. He talked about the support he received from his family as he grew up with Tourettes Syndrome. He has a passion for drumming and has combined his life experiences with his musical talents to deliver speaking engagements aimed at encouraging people to see the humanity and gifts of each other. Later in the day, people had the opportunity to jam with him in a drumming session.

Attendees of the conference were able to visit three workshop sessions as well as network with other DSPs working at the approximately twenty agencies throughout the Hudson Valley that comprise the MHC. All attendees received free MHC membership included in their registration. This will be especially helpful to defer un-reimbursed educational expenses. Several NHR staff stepped it up this year and became presenters. Monica Robinson (Angelo Blvd) and Veronie Anderson (Overlook) gave a presentation of how they have attempted to increase DSP satisfaction with the workplace by applying lessons from the College of Frontline Supervision and Management in their sites. Sylvania Brown (Overlook) and Nadine Lewis (Clintondale) shared the work they have been doing in their journey to become certified DSP-Cs from the National Alliance of Direct Support Professionals. The course materials on the College of Direct Support and particularly the development of a portfolio that demonstrates the ability to apply the knowledge in the workplace has been a transformational experience for them and their fellow DSP-Rs. Ask them about it. Barbara DelVentura presented on the formation of the Direct Support Alliance of NYS, DSPANY.

The closing ceremony consisted of the presentation of the Frank Mulhern Scholarships and a live performance of "Open Your Eyes" by DSP Sean Delaney. Frank was especially eloquent in his praise for the powerful and important work performed by DSPs. Sean's rap song has powerful lyrics about a call to action for DSPs to raise awareness of the importance of not only the work we perform but the humanity of those we serve.
